- Degenerative disc disease & surgeries left Kyle unable to walk
- Received new 4 ton Ducane heat pump system & ductwork for home

Jacob Scheffel of Montana

- Jacob sold and installed waste oil furnaces & boilers throughout Montana
- Jacob incurred a T4 complete spinal cord injury from a dirt bike accident
- Received driving controls & wheelchair lift for his truck

Francisco Santibanez of Virginia

- Francisco did carpentry and roofing work for a New York construction firm
- Francisco was paralyzed from the waist down after falling from a roof
- Received hard surface flooring & had carpets removed from his home

Larry Willis of Missouri

- Larry was an architect for HOK and other firms in Kansas City
- Larry was diagnosed with an inherited condition of muscular dystrophy which severely limited his ability to use both his arms and legs
- Received hardware, software & assistive technology allowing him to once again work as an architect

Ralph Clark of Florida

- Ralph was a sheet metal worker in the Jacksonville, Florida area
- A few years after retiring, Ralph developed progressive Alzheimer's
- Received a complete new roof for his home

Elijah Walters of Texas

- Elijah was a self-employed general contractor
- A horse riding accident caused Elijah to become legally blind
- Received a complete new roof for his home
